# Card Craps

## **How to Play**

Card Craps is a Las Vegas-style Craps game that uses cards to determine the outcome of the hand. There are six (6) numbered cards, each card representing the side of a six-sided cube. The shooter rolls the cubes to the opposite side of the table. The number on each cube dictates which cards are used to determine the winning roll. For example: if the shooter rolls a two and a four the second and fourth cards are used to determine the winning hand.

## **Pass Line Bet**

The Pass Line wins on a 7 or 11 and loses on a 2, 3, or 12 on the come out roll. If a 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, or 10 is rolled it is called "the point". The bet wins if the point is rolled and loses if a seven is rolled. Taking the odds (3x, 4x, and 5x) on the Pass Line is an optional wagers after the point is established.

## **Don't Pass Bet**

The Don't Pass Line wins on a 2 or 3, loses on a 7 or 11, and pushes on a 12 on the come out roll. If a 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, or 10 is rolled it is called "the point". The bet wins if a seven is rolled and loses if the point is rolled. Laying the odds (max lay is 6x) is an optional wager on the Don't Pass Line bet after the point is established.

## **Place Bets**

A Place Bet is an optional bet on the 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, or 10 and wins if the number is rolled before a seven.

## Lay Bets

A Lay Bet is a bet against the number and wins if a seven is rolled before the 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, or 10.

## **Come Bets**

The Come Bet is like a Pass Line Bet after the point is established and wins on 7 or 11 and loses on 2, 3, or 12.

## **Don't Come Bets**

The Don't Come Bet is like a Don't Pass Line Bet after the point is established and wins on 2, 3, or 12 and loses on 7 or 11.

## **Field Bets**

The Field Bet is a one-time bet that the next roll will be a 2, 3, 4, 9, 10, 11, or 12. All bets win even money except for the 2 and 12, which pay double.

Cubes do not determine the outcome. See game for details.



Dealer Open Pai Gow is an exciting **commission-free** Pai Gow game, played with a 53- card deck, consisting of the standard 52 cards plus 1 Joker. The player begins by placing a Pai Gow wager. Optionally, the player may place a Jacks Beat or Chan Chu side wager. Each player is then dealt 7 cards facedown, and the **dealer is dealt 7 cards face-up**. If the dealer has 2 or more Jacks, all wagers are immediately resolved. Otherwise, the dealer sets their cards into a 5-card hand and a 2-card hand, according to the House Way. The player then sets their cards into a 5-card hand and a 2-card hand and a 2-card hand, and all wagers are then resolved.

## HOW TO PLAY

If the dealer has 2 or more Jacks, the Pai Gow wager loses. Otherwise, the dealer and player hands are compared in regular Pai Gow Poker fashion, 5-card to 5-card and 2- card to 2-card, with the Joker functioning as a semiwild "bug", able to complete straights and/or flushes, or otherwise acting as a suitless Ace. If the player beats the dealer in both comparisons, the Pai Gow wager wins and pays 1 to 1. If the player beats the dealer in one of the two comparisons, the wager pushes. If each comparison results in the player being beaten by or tying the dealer, the wager loses.



JACKS BEAT is an optional side bet that wins when the dealer has 2 or more Jacks among their seven cards. JACKS BEAT pays according to the player's highest 5-card hand that can be formed, and is not dependent on how the player's hands are set. JACKS BEAT pays according to the posted pay table.

CHAN CHU PAI GOW POKER is an optional side bet that considers the player's best possible hand among their seven cards and wins when a qualifying hand is made. CHAN CHU pays according to the posted pay table.

The optional BONUS SPIN XTREME bet wins when a qualifying hand is made.

#### Pair Plus®

Pair Plus lets you bet against your own hand. If your hand contains a pair or better, you win!

#### Ante

Ante lets you play against the dealer's hand. It's just your cards against the dealer's. If you bet on the ante and like your hand, you must place an equal wager on the play spot. It's your threecard poker hand against the dealer's three-card poker hand, and the best hand wins!

#### **To Play Both**

It's you and your cards for a pair or better and it's you against the dealer for the best three-card poker hand. You must also make the play wager or you will forfeit the ante wager.

#### Ante Bonus

If you make the ante and play wagers, you may win an ante bonus payout even if the dealer doesn't qualify, and even if the dealer's hand beats your hand.

#### **6 Card Bonus**

Combine your hand with the dealer's three-card hand to make your best five-card poker hand. You win with a three-of-a-kind or better. See paytable for odds.
